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GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:

Under general direction, provides oversight and maintenance of the City's GIS mapping and related databases. Works within prescribed standards and procedures, with some leeway for independent judgment.

ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS:

Provides support to the Public Works Director, Community Development Director, Parks and Recreation Director and fellow crew members of the department.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

The following duty statements are not intended and should not be construed to be an exhaustive list of all responsibilities, skills, efforts, or working conditions associated with this job. It is intended to be a reflection of the principal job elements essential for making compensation decisions. The City reserves the right to modify or change duties or essential functions of this job at any time.

- Prepares routine drawings and maps; prepares as-build drawings
- Maintains GIS maps and databases
- Provides coordination of GIS related components with other agencies
- Performs data collection, data entry, maintenance and updating of GIS mapping
- Coordinates integration of GIS into other software programs
- Assists others in researching records

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Ability to utilize ESRI and mapping software
- Understanding of computer database management, excel, and word processing software
- Working knowledge of common hazards and safety precautions necessary for public works operation
- Ability to drive a manual transmission vehicle (and must possess a valid Colorado driver's license and an acceptable motor vehicle record)
- Effective communication and teamwork skills to foster good working relationships with employees, other agencies, and the general public
- Listening and questioning skills to ensure understanding are important in performing the job competently

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Any combination of education and experience equivalent to graduation from technical school and two (2) years of experience in drafting or GIS (Auto Cad preferred). Must have knowledge of surveying, mathematics, and land records; knowledge and understanding of GIS hardware and software operations; understanding of personal computers, plotters, printers and associated hardware and software. A bachelor's degree in civil engineering, engineering technology, or geography is preferred. Must possess a valid Colorado driver's license.

Inside/Outside: Work inside 75% and outside 25%
